We know that many feel overwhelmed trying to keep up with the constant evolution of games, apps and social media platforms and are quite often understandably worried about, online-bullying, grooming and what they are sharing online.

During this 90min session, Richard from The Stay Safe Initiative CIC will be helping you to understand your young peoples digital lives a bit more. Exploring what they are doing online, understanding the risks, and providing straight forward help and advice to keep everyone at home safe.

This has been designed purely to provide you with as much information as possible, to allow you to make informed decisions and choices about your young peoples digital lives. Due to the nature of certain risks the online world holds for children, this presentation is **NOT** for the eyes and ears of children and young people.

Alarming statistics underscore the urgency of this matter

Reports of child sexual abuse imagery involving school children online have skyrocketed by 1500% since the onset of lockdown, as reported by the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF).

The NSPCC's report reveals an 83% surge in online grooming crimes against children in the past four years.

Additionally, the Anti-bullying Alliance reports that 1 in 5 children has experienced some form of online bullying in the last 12 months, and a concerning 72% of those who endure online bullying also face it at school or during school hours.

These statistics are not intended to instill fear, but rather to emphasize the necessity of collective involvement and guidance. With everyone's commitment, we can work towards reducing these alarming statistics and ensuring the digital well-being of our families.
