Draw a picture of yourself.

Around the outside draw a picture of the important people in your life.



### Art

Create some outer-space art!

This can be a space-themed picture of your choice, using whichever artistic materials you like.



### Science

Go on a seasonal scavenger hunt.

Can you go outside and find some signs of spring? Draw what you find, do some rubbings, or even take some pictures to share with us!
