- Create a poster all about a multiplication fact you find tricky to remember. Can you come up with different representations of your fact.

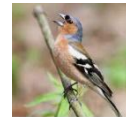
Writing

- Go for a walk and see how many different types of birds you can see. Take time to sit and listen to their song and imagine what it would have been like to be a Viking settler arriving and hearing/see these sights for the first time.
- Using things outside create a collection of outdoor art to represent the products of a tricky timestable.

Map Task

- Show on a map where Vikings travelled to. Were there places they travelled to but did not settle? Could you use a key to show the purpose of their travel?

- This first-person account will soon get the reader involved as they place themselves in the thick of the action, as if they were really there defending the Viking stronghold of York.



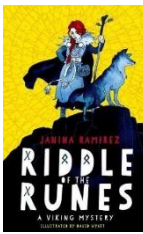
