Understanding the world

Track the weather for a few days ☀️ ☁️

What do you notice? How many rainy days do we have?

How many sunny days do we have?

Can you make a weather dial



Writing

Read 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

Can you write what the caterpillar eats on each day?

Understanding the world

Find some seeds and plant them, you could plant flowers, fruit or vegetable seeds.

Think carefully about what the seeds will need to help them grow.

Can you keep a 'plant diary' to keep track of how well it is growing?



Baking

Carefully follow instructions to make butterfly themed fairy cakes.

Could you add some colourful decorations?

Can you make a butterfly or caterpillar using nature?

Can you find colourful petals and leaves?



Maths

Composition of numbers to 10.

Make two groups of objects e.g. 5 and 3

How many in each group? How many all together?

Repeat to make numbers up to 10.

You could also count out a group of objects e.g. 10 and see how you can split them into two groups to make 10 in diff ways e.g. groups of 4 and 6, 3 and 7
