

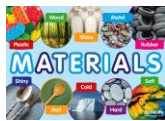
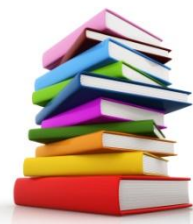
Year 1 Homework – Term 1

History Speak to the oldest member of your family. How did they communicate when they were younger? What were the inside of homes (especially kitchens) like in the past? What was school like?	Writing Write a postcard from an adventure, real or imaginary, that you have been on recently. Remember to draw a picture on the front so we know where it happened.	Mental Health and Well-Being Task What makes you special? Tell your class something special about you! 
Art Leaf printing. Use paint to print the leaves onto paper. Or complete some leaf rubbings using wax crayons.	Science Materials – go on a hunt around your home. How many things can you find that are made of wood, plastic, metal, fabric, glass, paper and rock? Do an experiment to find out which materials are waterproof. 	Read Visit your local library and find some autumn themed books. Which was your favourite? 
Maths Go for a walk and collect some sticks. How many did you find? Can you put them into size order? Can you sort them in any other ways? Make a picture using your sticks.	Family time Choose an activity to do with your family that everyone will enjoy. You could: play a boardgame, watch a film, read a book, go for a bike ride. Remember to take photos to share with us!
